Where will it be based?

We are hoping that all face-to-face days will be hosted in Brunei; however, this is subject to recruitment to a viable cohort size.

How does the programme work?

The programme is part of the National College Leadership Curriculum and consists of 2 Essential and 1 Elective Module.

Each module has 50 hours of work: face-to-face; online, applied tasks, collaborative learning groups. Participants undertake a longer school-based leadership project. All work is at M-level.

How much does the programme cost?

We are offering NPQML at £1,050 to FOBISIA schools. In addition those who apply from schools outside of England will also need to pay £225 for their final assessment.
