This programme is divided into 3 distinct stages:

- **Postgraduate Certificate** - Stage 1 (3 x 20 credit courses) Year 1
- **Postgraduate Diploma** - Stage 2 (3 x 20 credit courses) Year 2
- **MA Dissertation** - Stage 3 (60 Masters credits) Year 3

### **What will I do?**

Students are encouraged to assimilate new knowledge, undertake practical research and enquiry and encompass forward looking concepts and constructs based on theory, principles gleaned from research and from critically reviewing practical experience.

### **What will I get?**

There is a choice of courses available.

- Postgraduate Certificate a one year 60 credit course;
- Postgraduate Diploma requires 120 Masters level credits
- The award of Masters Degree in SEN and Inclusion requires 180 Masters level credits. Students may interrupt or transfer credits at any stage of the programme.
